## Salt of the Earth

Shake up your perspective with a tour through Bolivia's dreamlike Salar de Uyuni salt flats.

When it comes to Bolivia's Salar de Uyuni—the world's largest salt flats—humble salt is way more than a food enhancer. Within the 4,086-square-mile stretch of blindingly white desert, salt seasons hot springs, fortifies flamingos that migrate to its lagoons, and serves as building material for bowls, chairs, and even houses made by the indigenous Quechua people. Ponder the vastness on a new tour from [Cox & Kings](#); days spent exploring volcanoes and islandlike mounds of fossilized coral are capped by nights in an Airstream in the middle of it all. \$5,915, [coxandkingsusa.com](#) —AISLYN GREENE
